AWAM was half of a joint venture that designed the College of Education renovation and Department of Computer Science addition. The project received the AIA East Tennessee Honor Award in 2001 and the Masonry Institute of TN Excellence in Masonry Merit Award in 2002. The complex is located in the center of campus where major vehicular and pedestrian corridors intersect. The site design features landscaped open green spaces separating the complex from the street thus providing a pedestrian friendly passage through the heavily traveled intersection. The existing 60,000 s.f. 1957 Philander P. Claxton Building building was gutted and completely renovated. This 82,720 sf renovation and new construction was completed 2000 at a total construction cost of \$8,830,523, or \$107/sf.

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The exterior of the building was restored to its original condition preserving the collegiate gothic architecture that is prevalent on campus. All exterior windows and doors were replaced. A small two story wing was demolished to make way for a new four story 22,720 s.f. addition for the Department of Computer Science. The addition was designed as a modern interpretation of the classic collegiate gothic style. Connecting all floors is a new two story Lobby entry with a three story monumental staircase. Extensive use of terrazzo flooring and pre-finished wood panel system enhances the interior of the renovated building and new addition throughout common spaces, office suites and large classrooms. Also, customized system furniture and signage were installed throughout.




