This project, begun in 1983 under a prototype program with the state of Tennessee, underwent several design modifications over the following ten years before the client settled upon a hybrid design developed by Architects Weeks Ambrose McDonald, Inc. The Owner called for several program revisions due to the ever-changing role of the army reserve program. Ultimately a portion of the original design was retained and a new section added from a more recent prototype. The two were blended together to create a unique facility. The project consists of a high-bay main assembly hall with supporting kitchen, locker room and storage facilities. The lower structured main entry section contains offices, recruiting areas and classrooms. A high-bay vehicle maintenance facility in the rear services military vehicles used by the Army National Guard, some of which are stored on site. The 22,200 sf armory was completed in 1996 at a total construction cost of \$1,369,000, or \$62/sf.
