Front Facade and Main Entry

This facility replaced an older, outdated and smaller facility on a former elementary school site that also houses county offices. The site is in a mostly rural and residential neighborhood that is very near downtown and the Tennessee River. The building design reflects the residential character of the neighborhood with its gabled shingled roof, porte cochere and porch lantern light fixtures. The 9,915 sf health care facility was completed in 2004 at a total construction cost of \$1,083,000, or \$109/sf.

The building is designed around a central administrative core with adult and children's areas separated to each side around the perimeter. Additional spaces include outreach rooms for private patient conferences, staff conference, offices, dental suite and break room. The front porte cochere serves as a drop off area for patients and the handicapped. Extensive use of color throughout the building using ceramic and vinyl tile, wood wainscoting and vinyl wall covering enhances the indoor environment to create a pleasant atmosphere.



Mother's Room

The building design incorporates special features to accommodate HIPPA guidelines for health departments as it relates to patient privacy. The check-in stations are equipped with sound panels both beside and above each station to ensure patient privacy. All exam rooms have sound attenuation blankets in the walls. A low slope roof over the conference room contains rooftop HVAC equipment which is concealed from view by the gabled shingled roof.
