
New Chorus Suite

After completion of the adjacent new career center which relocated the vocational labs and classrooms into the new facility, **AWAM** redesigned the vocational wing of the high school for a new choral suite, classrooms and a computer lab. Included in the redesign is a new façade that identifies this portion of the facility as an adult education center open after school hours for the community. To tie the two separate facilities together as a cohesive whole for the Lenoir City High School campus, the aesthetic of the exterior is similar to the neighboring G. Wayne Miller Career and Technical Center. The 10,130 sf renovation was completed in 2008 at a cost of \$1,325,548, or \$131/sf. The equivalent cost for a new facility in 2016 is estimated at \$1,620,800, or \$160/sf.



Classroom

One of the old high bay vocational shops was converted into a choral suite with practice rooms, storage, offices and a choral practice room complete with risers and special acoustical treatment required for vocal rehearsals. The other high bay space was converted into a state-of-the-art computer lab that serves both students and adults. The specialty ceiling creates a high tech look that provides an exciting environment for collaborative and individual learning experiences. The main lobby also boasts a specialty ceiling system, curved glass block wall and a "portal" entry into the computer lab that draws you into the space. Other spaces included in the renovated area are classrooms, toilet facilities and support spaces.
